
1 USD = 68.9 INR (Approx.) 1 EUR = 77.3 INR (Approx.)

Major currencies can be exchanged into Indian rupee at the airport, hotels. Credit cards, e.g. VISA, MasterCard, and American Express are all widely accepted.

#### 10. Electricity

India uses 230 Volts, 50 Hz alternating current as the power source. Plugs and sockets have either grounded / earthed 3 Pin connections (Type D) or ungrounded 2 pin connections (Type C).

The two pin plug has round pins. There are no fixed live (hot) and neutral (cold) terminals and can be inserted either way in the sockets.



The three pin plug is rated at 6A / 250V. It has three round pins in a triangular pattern. The earth terminal is slightly larger than the live and neutral terminals.

#### Climate and clothing

The weather in New Delhi in November is pleasant with temperature varying from 14-30 degrees centigrade. Light to medium clothes are best for everyday wear.

#### **Internet connections**

Free high speed Wi-Fi internet access will be available to delegates inside the meeting venues. Wi-Fi internet access is available at hotels in New Delhi free or chargeable basis according to hotel policy.

#### Language

Hindi is the official language of India, though English is widely spoken. Signs, however, are often written in both languages.

#### **Meal facilities**

There are a number of good restaurants within walking distance of the hotels which serve both lunch and dinner.

#### **Smoking**

In India, smoking is prohibited in public buildings and other places open to the public. This also includes offices, public transportation, hotels, bars, restaurants and all other establishments where food and beverage are served. You must be 18 years old or more to buy tobacco and tobacco products in India.

## **Telephones**

All regular telephone numbers in Delhi consist of eight digits, and there are area codes (the area code for Delhi is 011). In case of emergency, the police can be contacted through number 100 and ambulance through 101.

To call India, the international telephone access code is +91 (city code)(number). To call from India, the outgoing code from India is 00 (country code)(city code)(number).

For calls from your hotel, please enquire directly at the reception.

#### Time zone

The time zone for India is Greenwich Mean Time + 5.30 hours.

This time zone remains unchanged throughout the year.
