OVERVIEW

The Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), which serves as the National Standards Body of India, was established under the BIS Act of 1986. It took over the functions of the former Indian Standard Institution (ISI). BIS plays a crucial role in the harmonious development of standardization, marking, and quality certification of goods.

Through its core activities of standardization and conformity assessment, BIS significantly contributes to the national economy. It achieves this by ensuring the availability of safe, reliable, and high-quality goods, thereby minimizing health hazards for consumers. Additionally, BIS plays a vital role in protecting the environment, promoting exports, and reducing dependence on imports. It also helps control the proliferation of product varieties, among other benefits. The standards and certification scheme implemented by BIS not only benefits consumers and industries but also supports various public policies. These policies, particularly in areas such as product safety, consumer protection, food safety, environment protection, building and construction, are greatly facilitated by BIS.

BIS, Guwahati branch office is a crucial entity in the domain of quality control and standardization. As an integral part of the BIS network, it ensures that products manufactured and sold in the northeast region of India comply with national standards, striving to protect consumer interests by upholding quality benchmarks. Situated strategically in Guwahati, GHBO functions as a reliable source of expertise in various industries. With a committed team comprising trained professionals and technical experts, the BIS Guwahati branch office provides valuable assistance by facilitating conformity assessments, standards promotion, surveillance of hallmarking centres and Jewellers, and disseminating knowledge through training programs and exposure visits. Its presence underscores the importance of upholding quality across all sectors within the region and signifies the commitment of the Indian government towards fostering economic growth while safeguarding consumer well-being.

TIMELINE OF BIS, GUWAHATI OFFICE

Since 1972, the Inspection Office of the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) was operating in Tinsukia, providing a test facility for Plywood Tea Chest Products. In order to meet the needs of Quality Control/Systems, Certification, and training for industries in the North Eastern region, which includes Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Tripura, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram and Nagaland, the Guwahati Branch office (GHBO) was established on 08-01-2016.

The Guwahati Laboratory, which began operations in 1987 with a 40-tonne Universal Testing Machine, now offers testing facilities for Plywood, HSD Steel bars, Asbestos sheets, Containers for PDW and PNMW, Dunnage Pellets, Steel countersunk head wire Nails, Cement, and Autoclaved Aerated Concrete blocks. The BIS Guwahati office is currently located in the HOUSEFED Complex, Dispur, Guwahati - 781006, occupying approximately 9930 sq. ft of space for the office and laboratory on the second floor, and around 900 sq. ft of space for the laboratory on the ground floor of the west end building block.


The North – Eastern states of India covered under the Jurisdiction of GHBO




CONFORMITY ASSESSMENT – PERFORMANCE AND ACHIVEMENTS

GHBO has secured Rank 1 in Efficiency Index in the Months of April, October, November, December 2022, January and February 2023.





Performance in certification activity 2021-22 vs 2022-23





Income generated by GHBO from certification activity has shown a downward trend during 2022-23 as compared to 2021-22 despite the increase in licensees on account of the concessions provided to Micro and Woman entrepreneur units and additional 10% concession provided to units in North Eastern states as per the Gazette Notification dated 05-August 2021.





ENFORCEMENT AND COMPLAINTS – CONSUMER ENGAGEMENT

GHBO has successfully conducted search and seizure operations to combat the misuse of the ISI mark. We received numerous complaints regarding the violation of QCO on HSD Steel bars, sub-standard quality of ISImarked products, corrugated coloured roofing sheets with fake ISI marking, misuse of Hallmark by jewellers, and misuse of ISI mark on packaged drinking water. Our team conducted thorough investigations at the complainant-end, licensee-end, and shops as applicable, brought the cases to logical conclusions, which were then closed by the competent authority.





In addition, we have taken proactive measures to ensure the implementation of the Toys (Quality Control) Order 2020 and its subsequent amendments. Our team has conducted visits to malls, airports, and large/organized outlets. These visits were aimed at verifying the implementation of the order and ensuring that the quality of toys being sold meets the required standards.

GHBO in coordinated with State government officials have formed State Level Committee (SLC) in all seven States of North East India. During 2022-23, the 1st meeting of the State Level Committee on Standardization for the


state of Mizoram was organized on 17.01.2023 at SAW Conference Hall, Mizoram Secretariat, chaired by the Chief Secretary Dr. Renu Sharma, IAS. The committee stressed on creation of Standardization Cells in Govt. Dept., Certification of Piped drinking water, awareness about Hallmarking of Gold jewellery and its implementation by involving Self-Help groups, Capacity building of government dept. Standards formulation, promotion and implementation. Emphasis was given to the need for the Government Departments to work in tandem with BIS to achieve the objectives of the committee. Deputy Director General Eastern Region (DDGE), Shri Dibyendu Chakrabarti, Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) as a member of the committee emphasised that relevant Standards may be referred to in their tenders and State Government should procure ISI Marked goods wherever available. He also requested the State Govt. to go for Certification of Piped Drinking Water, Prevent the sale of Non-ISI Packaged Drinking Water, Implementation of Quality Control Orders, setting up Assaying Hallmarking Centers in the State of Mizoram. He stressed the need for the creation of a Standardization Cell in

Government Departments, the formation of Student Clubs for a better understanding of Quality, Safety and Standardization in Schools and the Implementation of Management System Certification in Government Departments.



LEARNING SCIENCE VIA STANDARDS

GHBO has developed lesson plan on Microwave Oven, IS 11676: 1995 as part of the initiative on learning science via Standards.



DISTRICT LEVEL OFFICERS TRAINING

GHBO has so far covered 11 districts in the states of Assam, Tripura, Manipur and Mizoram for conducting district level officers (DLO) training. MANAK MANTHAN

Three Manak Manthans were conducted by GHBO during the period, a brief report are as follows:

1. Manak Manthan on Fortified Rice Kernel (FRK), IS 17782: 2021, was carried out on 31-05-2022 with manufacturers of FRK. During the deliberation it was brought to light that Department of Food and Public Distribution System has published an operational Guidelines for fortification of rice which is not in is not in line with IS 17782 however, the said is being cited in tenders published by other states, inputs on

- implementation issues of ISS were also received. These outcomes were forwarded to CMD, relaxations were made in the scheme of inspection and testing subsequently GHBO has granted a licence for FRK which was the first licence for the product in ERO.
- 2. GHBO's highest licensees are of Packaged Drinking Water (other than PNMW) as per IS 14543; these licensees are also required to show compliance to IS 15410, Containers for PDW and PNMW during the operation of their licence. Hence, with the issuance of amendment no. 6 to IS 15410 in May 2022, a Manak Manthan on Amendment no. 6 to IS 15410 was carried out with the licensees of IS 14543. Some important inputs were shared like incorporating minimum wall thickness in the Standard and also to look into whether bottles can be permitted to be reused. Inputs were forwarded to concerned technical department.
- 3. Manak Manthan on Steel Tubes and poles was carried out on 02-11-2022 with the manufacturers,

- material suppliers and raw customers. The outcome of deliberations and suggested changes required in the Indian standards of IS 10748, IS 1161, IS 1239 Part 1, IS 2713, IS 3589, IS 3601 and IS 4923 were forwarded **Technical** concerned to Department.
- 4. On 24-01-2023, Manak Manthan was held for Plywood and Similar Products with its manufacturers and Quality control personnel. Inputs regarding the need to update the standard with respect to additional grade, permitting new species of timbers as per availability and other proposed changes were forwarded to concerned technical department.



5. Manak Manthan on Plastics and Similar Products was carried out with manufacturers. manufacturers, Raw material suppliers in collaboration with CIPET, Guwahati. Deliberations resulted in proposing new Indian Standard for HDPE Pipes with silicon coating and Polystyrene Geo Bags, Separate Standard for Sheathing other Ducts and changes required in the existing standards. **Proposals** were forwarded to SCMD and technical concerned departments.

JEWELLERS AWARENESS PROGRAMS

GHBO has actively conducted Jeweller awareness programs regarding mandatory certification of jewellery across the North Eastern States of India through various means such Newspaper campaigns, Press meets, and Jeweller surveillance. No. of registered hallmarking jewellers North Eastern Region has increased six times from pre mandatory period to the present.

GUWAHATI, Oct 21: In order to create awareness among consumers on hallmarking of gold jewellery during the ensuing festive season of Dhanteras and Diwali, the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) in association with the Northeast Centre for Equity Action on Integrated Development (NEAID) organised a sensitisation programme in the city today.

As part of the programme, street plays were organised at locations like Dispur, Fancy Bazar and Ulubari areas of the city.

procured is having the
required purity is by asking
for hallmarked jewellery and
ensuring the three marks –
BIS standard mark, purity of
gold and fineness.

"However, the awareness among consumers is still not high which makes them susceptible to undercaratage," he added.

He also advised that in case the hallmark is not clearly visible by the naked eye, one should ask for a magnifying glass from the jewellers.

Deep Deka, hallmarking agent of BIS Guwahati, informed that the six-digit alphanumeric code, which is also known as hallmark unique identification (HUID) number, on the jewellery can be verified through BIS Care app to obtain information on the authenticity of the ornament.

Vijay Gauraw, deputy director, BIS urged the consumers to purchase hallmarked jewellery with a proper bill containing details of the articles, name of the shop, weight in grams, cartage, date of purchase, assaying charges, etc., as it helps to maintain traceability.

It was further informed by the representatives that the jewellers can apply for registration which is free of cost and they can apply online.
