

DLO TRAINING PROGRAMES

The introduction of the District Level Officers (DLO) Training program serves as a capacity-building initiative by BIS, which is specifically designed to educate and raise awareness among state government officials about the relevant Indian Standards pertaining to the products managed within their respective departments. Its primary objective is to enhance the knowledge and awareness of these officials regarding the applicable standards, thereby empowering them to effectively implement and enforce quality regulations within their areas of responsibility. An additional alignment of these trainings with the State Flagship Schemes yielded multifold benefits including identification of common objectives by both BIS and the district officials. The DLO training programmes are typically conducted at the district headquarters, chaired by the District Collector. While in 2021-22, only 3 such programmes could be conducted, in 2022-23, the number substantially rose to 13 DLO trainings. All these programs received enthusiastic support from the State Government and District Administration. More than 500 district level officials from various departments of the state government participated in the programs organized this year. The training focused on the usage of Indian Standards in the procurement process, ensuring quality in public works, and utilizing the online resources and tools developed by BIS for all stakeholders. After each program, feedback was collected from the District Administration through an online portal to gather suggestions for improving the training program.
